Choose the correct answer or answers for each question:

- 1) Providers may be reimbursed for:
 - Meals provided to the provider's own children, if the provider is income eligible, and when at least one nonresident child is participating in that meal service.
 - A breastmilk-only lunch for a 4-month-old, enrolled infant when the child's mother breastfeeds the baby onsite.
 - A bag lunch that includes all required meal components sent by the provider with a school-aged child.
 - A maximum number of two meals and one snack or two snacks and one meal per child per day.

- 2) At least two of the required annual reviews by the Area Coordinator must be unannounced and at least one unannounced review must include observation of a meal or snack service.

- 3) When providers mention participating in the CACFP in their policy or on their website, they must include
 - The current non-discrimination statement, including the complaint-filing procedure, or a link to it, on the home page in the same font as the other text.
 - Stating that they participate in the Child and Adult Care Food Program is all they need to do.
 - If there isn't room for the full statement, the provider must state, "This institution is an equal opportunity provider" in font no smaller than the rest of the text.

- 4) A Special Diet Form and Special Dietary Needs Tracking Form
 - Is required anytime a child cannot be fed according to CACFP guidelines due to Allergy, Intolerance or other Disability.
 - Is required if the parent or guardian prefers a non-dairy milk substitution that is nutritionally-equivalent to dairy milk due to religious, ethnic or lifestyle reasons.
 - Must be signed by a Physician, Physician Assistant, Nurse Practitioner, Advanced Practice Nurse Prescriber, dentist, optometrist or podiatrist regardless of the reason for the Special Diet.
 - Is required to credit breastmilk to replace cow's milk of the appropriate fat content for a meal served to a child over the age of one year.

- 5) Food Program records must be
 - Recorded daily on CACFP.Net and submitted by the 5th day of the following month.

- Available for review by representative of WECA, DPI, or USDA at any time during normal business hours.
 - Retained for the current year plus the three prior years.
 - Stored onsite
- 6) Meals/snacks may be disallowed when
- The Area Coordinator attempts an in-person Home Visit and the provider has not reported that they will be away from child care.
 - Menu and attendance are not up-to-date and available through the previous business day during a Home Visit.
 - The number of children a provider claims exceeds their authorized capacity
 - A whole grain source is not served at least once per day
 - 100% juice is served more than one time per day.

7) Which of the following are examples of denying equal access to the CACFP:

- Failing to provide reasonable accommodation to individuals with disabilities.
- Failing to enroll *drop in* children.
- Not enrolling infants.
- Asking or requiring parents to provide their infant's food.

8) Which of the following are creditable meals or snacks according to CACFP guidelines:

- 4-6 ounces of breastmilk for an infant breakfast for a child 5 months of age.
- 28 grams or ½ of a whole grain English Muffin topped with ½ ounce (1 T) of tomato sauce, 2 ounces mozzarella cheese and ½ ounce of sauteed ground beef; ½ c. lettuce salad; ½ c mandarin oranges; and 1 cup of 1% milk for dinner for a child who is 6 years old.
- 14 grams or 1 graham cracker and ½ cup serving of 1% chocolate milk for snack for a child who is 4 years old.
