## WHO WE ARE

WECA, the state affiliate of National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), was founded in 1971 to provide the first statewide conferences for Wisconsin's child care providers. The earliest days of the organization were led by a part-time executive director and a volunteer staff. WECA has continued to evolve and innovate to meet the growing needs of early childhood educators and early care and

education in Wisconsin by administering key programs, advancing advocacy efforts, and providing professional development opportunities.

# WHAT WE OFFER

## **Educational and Professional Development**

T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood<sup>®</sup> Wisconsin Program scholarships help make higher education more affordable - and sometimes nearly FREE! We also offer dozens of professional development credit hours each year through our annual conference, free shared service program training sessions, and other training opportunities.

## **Business Practices and Capacity Building**

WECA's shared services network is a national leader in helping child care programs develop strong business practices and increase efficiency so child care owners and administrators can focus more on what matters most - nurturing young children. Programs enrolled in Wisconsin Early Education Shared Services Network have access to thousands of business resources, including customizable templates and policies, tax guides, cost savings opportunities, coaching, and much more. WECA also helps build the capacity and sustainability of child care programs across the state through a variety of long- and short-term projects, including pre-licensing services in the northern and southeastern regions and coaching, professional development, and other regional resources.

### **Food Systems Resources**

The Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) offers partial reimbursement for serving healthy meals and snacks. Wisconsin's CACFP sponsors serve family child care businesses and centers - WECA is eligible to assist family programs in all 72 counties and all Tribal nations. WECA also offers food system supports for programs enrolled in shared services, including garden advice, recipes, food box distributions, and special garden projects.

### Membership and Advocacy

As NAEYC's state affiliate, WECA provides an important connection to the largest professional organization dedicated to the early childhood field in the United States. ## Wage Supplements

Paying livable wages is a challenge in the child care business model. The **REWARD Wisconsin Stipend Program** offers direct payments to providers based on their educational level. Those eligible can receive money to increase what they earn, helping child care programs stay in business and retain their staff.
