Whether you are starting a new child care or have been running one for a while, Build It Strong: Child Care Business Foundations Training is focused on providing the essential skills and proven strategies to make your program sustainable.

WHAT IS COVERED

Each interactive session explores key elements of successful child care business management topics.

- The Iron Triangle of Child Care Finance: Overview of the course with a focus on enrollment, fee collection, and revenues
- 2. Business Operations Part One: Expenses and income, creating a budget, rate setting, deductible expenses, and marketing
- **3. Business Operations Part Two:** Development of a business plan or business canvas, technology use for automation efficiencies, policies and procedures, and advanced budgeting
- **4. Engaging Outside Services:** What can and cannot be outsourced, obtaining business appropriate insurance, navigating legal issues, and child care regulation
- **5.** Accounting and Recordkeeping: Quality standards for fiscal management and planning and recordkeeping best practices.
- **6. Identifying and Prioritizing Funding:** Funding sources (e.g., Federal Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP), Wisconsin Shares, grants, parent fees) and guidance to ensure entrepreneurs' budgets are aligned with their funding and program goals
- **7. Setting-Specific Considerations for Group and Family Child Care Programs:** Split into groups to discuss considerations specific to each program type
 - Family child care has its own set of tax laws unique to that business type with required recordkeeping.
 - Group child care centers have other needs including HR support, staff retention, and administrative work at a much larger scale.
- **8. Professionalism in Early Childhood:** Legally binding contracts a key protective matter for businesses–and connections to professional organizations and other resources (local, regional, state, and national) beneficial to child care program owners
- **9.** Certification, Pre-Licensing, and Licensing: Support and resources for entrepreneurs navigating the process of becoming certified or licensed, including key information about commonly cited violations so programs can increase their compliance success.
